F1: The Movie (M)
Running Time: 155 minutes

Brad Pitt leads this Formula One thriller directed by **Joseph Kosinski** (*Top Gun: Maverick*), telling the story about a driver who comes out of retirement to mentor and team with a younger driver. **Damson Idris** (*Snowfall*) co-stars as his teammate at APXGP, a fictional team on the grid. The feature has been shot during actual Grand Prix weekends as the team competes against the titans of the sport.



Kōkā (M)

Running Time: 100 minutes

Kōkā is a powerful relationship drama following Māori elder Hamo (**Hinetu Dell**) and local delinquent Jo (**Darneen Christian**) who form an unlikely bond on a road trip in a Ford Falcon. Together they confront past traumas and each face their demons, their shared path becomes a journey of healing, community, and reconciliation.



How To Train Your Dragon (PG)

Running Time: 125 minutes

From three-time **Oscar®** nominee and **Golden Globe** winner **Dean DeBlois**, the creative visionary behind DreamWorks Animation's acclaimed *How to Train Your Dragon* trilogy, comes a stunning live-action reimagining of the film that launched the beloved franchise.

On the rugged isle of Berk, where Vikings and dragons have been bitter enemies for generations, Hiccup (Mason Thames) stands apart. The inventive yet overlooked son of Chief Stoick the Vast (Gerard Butler), Hiccup defies centuries of tradition when he befriends Toothless, a feared Night Fury dragon. Their unlikely bond reveals the true nature of dragons, challenging the very foundations of Viking society. With the fierce and ambitious Astrid (BAFTA nominee Nico Parker) and the village's quirky blacksmith Gobber (Nick Frost) by his side, Hiccup confronts a world torn by fear and misunderstanding.

As an ancient threat emerges, endangering both Vikings and dragons, Hiccup's friendship with Toothless becomes the key to forging a new future. Together, they must navigate the delicate path toward peace, soaring beyond the boundaries of their worlds and redefining what it means to be a hero and a leader.

Based on a true-ish story.




Bride Hard (M)


